

July 2015

- On July 1, 2015 India gave clearance to Bangladesh to open its fifth diplomatic mission in India.
- The new Deputy High Commission was opened in Guwahati, the capital of Assam.
- Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar on July 1, 2015 launched new automation software, ARPAN 3.0 for the over 12 lakh soldiers of the Indian Army which would provide them easy access to their service records including pay and leave details and transfer and postings among others.
- Army launched “Operation Shiva” on Jul 2, 2015, to ensure smooth conduct of about two-month long annual Amarnath Yatra in Jammu and Kashmir.
- The Supreme Court on July 6, 2015 directed that unwed mothers can get birth certificates issued for their biological children merely by furnishing an affidavit to this effect.
- The government of Meghalaya entered into collaboration with Microsoft India to launch ‘Smart Classroom’ programme in the state in July 2015.
- India halved its incidence of extreme poverty, from 49.4% in 1994 to 24.7% in 2011 ahead of the deadline of 2015 set by the United Nations, shows the Millennium Development Goals (MDG) Report 2015 released on July 2015.
- The World Bank has ranked India’s rural employment guarantee programme, MNREGA, as the world’s largest public works one, providing social security net to almost 15 per cent of the country’s population.
- The Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme as the second-largest unconditional cash transfer social security programme in the world ranked by World Bank.
- The government increased minimum wage across the country to Rs 160 a day from Rs 137 with effect from 1 July, 2015.
- In the month of July the Indian Government allowed foreign investors to conduct business through more than one joint venture in India.
- The Andhra Pradesh government is going to establish an ‘Energy University’ with focus on research orientation and development of energy efficiency, energy conservation, and renewable sources.
- According to the Union Tourism Ministry data, tourist arrivals in India registered a double-digit growth in 2014 over the previous year. Tamil Nadu remained the favorite destination for domestic and foreign visitors.
- After dithering for long, the Gujarat government issued a notification in July 2015, making voting in local body elections compulsory under the controversial Gujarat Local Authorities Laws (Amendment), Act 2009 (2014).
- Manila-headquartered Asian Development Bank (ADB) inked USD 300 million loan pact with the government to support the National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) in July 2015.
- With Greece’s failure to repay the roughly 1.6 billion euros (\$1.8 billion) to the IMF, Greece became the first developed country to fall into arrears on payments to the fund. The last country to do so was Zimbabwe in 2001.

- As per the Russian space agency, Russian cosmonaut Gennady Padalka, has set a new record for most time spent in space, with a total of 803 days.
- The World Health Organization announced that Cuba has become the first country in the world to stamp out transmission of HIV and syphilis from a mother to her child in July 2015.
- Tunisian President Beji Caid Essebsi, in a national address in July 2015 declared the state of emergency for a renewable period of 30 days after 38 tourists, mainly Britons, died in an attack in the resort city of Sousse.
- Chile won the Copa America title for the first time in its history after a dramatic penalty shootout against Lionel Messi's Argentina in the final in Santiago on July 4, 2015.
- France's Champagne vineyard where the world's famous sparkling wine is produced is now among UNESCO 'World Heritage' sites.
- The heads of state of Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa are meeting in the Russian city of Ufa for seventh BRICS Summit, to start the BRICS Development Bank in Shanghai, which will be headed by Indian banker K.V.Kamath for the first six years.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Russian President Vladimir Putin resolved to take strategic bilateral ties forward and discussed India's accession to the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO).
- In the month of July, 2015, India was accepted as a full member of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO), a six-member regional grouping, to which Prime Minister Narendra Modi offered to work in combating terror and boosting trade by easing barriers.
- India launched its heaviest commercial space mission ever with its polar rocket PSLV-C28 successfully putting five British satellites into the intended orbit after a flawless take off from the Satish Dhawan space Centre in July 2015.
- The New Development Bank (NDB) floated by the BRICS nations, formally started its operations at its headquarters in Shanghai.
- INSAT-3D, India's Advanced Weather Satellite, completed two successful years in orbit.
- China to connect world's largest telescope to supercomputer. When it is completed in 2016, the 500-metre aperture spherical telescope (Fast) will be the world's largest, overtaking Puerto Rico's Arecibo Observatory, which is only 300 meters in diameter.
- Uttar Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation (UPSRTC) has become the first State transport corporation to have a vehicle tracking system for inter-city buses.
- Software major Microsoft has agrees to support 'digital villages' in Maharashtra and develop a 'smart MIDC' apart from setting up a cyber-security centre in Pune.
- Indian Coast Guard commissioned 'ICGS Rani Durgavati', the 3rd Inshore Patrol Vessel (IPV) of its kind. The IPV designed and built by Hindustan Shipyard Limited.
- The Rashtriya Avishkar Abhiyan (RAA) was launched by Late Former President A P J Abdul Kalam The primary aim of RAA, is to inculcate a spirit of inquiry, creativity and love for science and mathematics in school children.

- World Population Day was observed on 11 July 2015 with theme Vulnerable Populations in Emergencies.
- Official air quality data for the first half of this year shows that Delhi indeed face high levels of pollution but Kanpur, Varanasi and Chennai are worse in terms of air pollution.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana, the National Skill Development Mission to train 400 million Indians by 2022.
- Telangana declared 'Bonalu' as the State festival and announced that total expenditure of the 'Bonalu' festivities will be officially borne by the state government.
- Hindustan University was chosen as Best Private University of the Year at a corporate summit organised by All India Technical and Management Council (AITMC).
- Indigenously designed and developed by CSIR-National Aerospace Laboratories (CSIR-NAL) Visibility Measuring System, "Drishti" has been installed at Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi.
- Delhi Metro has launched a smart card recharge facility at ICICI Bank's Business Correspondent Networks (outlets) across the national capital.
- Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved the proposal for restructuring the Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM) project, which is aimed at protecting and conserving the coastal environment.
- The Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority have clarified that (non-resident Indians (NRIs) can invest in National Pension System (NPS) to get a social security cover.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the government's flagship Deendayal Upadhyaya Rural Electrification Programme on July 25, 2015 in Patna.
- National Broadcasting day was observed on 23rd July, 2015. On this day in 1927, Indian Broadcasting Company began organized radio broadcasting from Bombay station.
- Madhya Pradesh has the highest number of malnourished children in the country with 74.1 per cent of those under the age of five suffering from anaemia and 60 per cent from malnutrition.
- UNESCO announced that Conakry the capital of Guinea in West Africa will be the World Book Capital for 2017.
- Seven Indian companies, including Reliance Industries and Tata Motors, are among the world's 500 largest companies, according to a list compiled by Fortune that has been topped by retail giant Walmart.
- The President has nominated Prof. Richard Hay and Mr. George Baker as members of the Anglo-Indian Community to the Lok Sabha.
- The first loan to be issued by the New Development Bank (NDB) of the five-nation BRICS bloc in April next year would be in Chinese currency Renminbi (RMB).
- The world's first malaria vaccine named Mosquirix, was given the green light by London-based European Medicines Agency.
- World Hepatitis Day, observed on July 28 every year, aims to raise global awareness of hepatitis.

- PAHAL scheme enters into Guinness Book of world records
 - Pratyaksha Hastaantarit Laabh (PAHAL) scheme
 - The scheme was formally launched as Direct Benefit Transfer Scheme for LPG subsidy in 2013 in 291 districts under the aegis of Union Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas. It was modified and christened as PaHal in November 2014 and was launched in 54 districts.
 - Later it was extended nationwide on 1 January 2015. Under the scheme, subsidized liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) cylinders are sold at market rates and consumers are entitled to receive LPG subsidy directly into their bank accounts.
 - It is done either through bank account or Aadhaar linkage. Currently it covers more than 9.75 crore LPG consumers across the country.
 - The scheme aims at eliminating duplication or bogus LPG connections and its diversion. It also seeks to meet substantive savings in LPG subsidy.

The award was presented to them by Union Minister of State (MoS) for Youth affairs and Sports Sarbananda Sonowal in New Delhi. M.R. - Search engine giant Google has announced to provide high-speed public Wi-Fi in 500 Indian railway stations. To set up public Wi-Fi hotspots, Google is working with the Indian Railways and RailTel, a government-owned provider of telecommunications infrastructure to the railways.
- Reliance Defence has signed a strategic Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Emirates Defence Industries Company (EDIC) in defence sector. The MoU seeks to boost partnership between both countries for manufacturing, knowledge transfer, services and technology development from the United Arab Emirates (UAE). Both companies will partner to jointly explore the opportunity for manufacturing and building capabilities in Aviation, defence vehicles and associated areas.
- Union Government has inked a loan agreement with Asian Development Bank (ADB) for US 123.51 million dollars for Infrastructure Development Investment Program. The 3-tranche loan will be used for upgrading tourism infrastructure and services in three states Punjab, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh.
- India's first dedicated satellite for astronomy research Astrosat has been successfully launched from Satish Dhawan Space Centre, Sriharikota. It was launched along with 6 foreign satellites by the ISRO's work horse Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle-C30 (PSLV-C30)
- Mathematician Dr. Jacob Tsimmerman from Canada has been chosen for the prestigious 2015 SASTRA Ramanujan Prize.
- India's ace cueist Pankaj Advani has won 2015 IBSF World Billiards Championship (Time Format) in Adelaide, Australia. It was his overall 14th World title.
- Mercedes driver Lewis Hamilton of Britain won 2015 Japanese Grand Prix title of Formula One.
- Indo-Swiss tennis pair of Sania Mirza and Martina Hingis won the women's doubles title of 2015 Guangzhou Open Tennis Tournament.
- United Nations on 25 September 2015 unanimously adopted an ambitious agreement on the outcome document New Sustainable Development Agenda for the next 15 years i.e. till 2030.
- The document in this regard was adopted in 70th session of United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) and was announced by its President Mogens Lykketoft at the UN headquarters in New York.
- German auto maker Volkswagen AG has appointed Matthias Mueller as its new chief executive officer (CEO).
- Former Indian Cricket team captain Sourav Ganguly was appointed as President of Cricket Association of Bengal (CAB).
- Union Government has given its approval for implementation of Integrated Air Command & Control System (IACCS) project of Indian Air force (IAF) with allocation of 8,000-crore rupees. Decision in this regard was taken by Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the proposal forwarded by the Defence Acquisition Council (DAC).

- Alexis Tsipras of left wing Syriza party has sworn in as the Prime Minister of Greece. He was administered oath to the office by the President Prokopis Pavlopoulos. It is second time; Alexis Tsipras has sworn in as the PM of Greece. Earlier in January 2015, he had sworn in for first becoming youngest PM of Greece since 1865 at the age of 40.
- Telecom service provider Uninor has rebranded itself as Telenor in India. The company also has changed its tag to 'Ab life full paisa vasool' from 'Sabse Sasta'. For the rebranding exercise, the company is going to spend around 100 crore rupees.
- Sherif Ismail has sworn-in as the new Prime Minister of Egypt. He was administered oath to the office by President Abdel-Fattah El-Sisi.
- Nepal has adopted new Constitution marking the country's transition to a secular and democratic republic. The new Constitution was unveiled by Nepalese President Ram Baran Yadav at a special ceremony held in Parliament at Kathmandu.
- India's Ajay Jayaram has won silver medal in 2015 Korea Open Badminton tournament in the Men's singles category.
- Ferrari driver Sebastian Vettel from Germany has won 2015 Singapore Grand Prix of Formula One.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched National Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS) in Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh to provide 24x7 power supply to every house.
- Union Government has launched the Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojana (PMKKKY) for the welfare of people affected by mining related operations.
- The Union Cabinet has approved Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Rurban mission (SPMRM) for its ambitious bid to spur social, economic and infrastructure development in rural areas. In this regard, Union Government has earmarked over 5,000 crore rupees for the mission to develop 300 clusters over next three years across the country.
- Hungarian Government has declared a state of emergency in its two regions of Csongrad and Bacs-Kiskun to cope with the influx of refugees. It was declared by Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban. This move could pave the way to bringing in Hungary's military to patrol the frontier bordering Serbia to stop illegal influx.
- Malcolm Turnbull has sworn-in as Australia's new Prime Minister. He became the 29th Prime Minister of the country and was administered oath to the office by Governor-General Peter Cosgrove.
- Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has been selected for the United Nations Champions of the Earth award.
- Healthcare firm Practo has acquired hospital management software firm Insta Health Solutions for 12 million dollars.
- Union Government has announced to extend e-Tourist Visa Scheme to 37 more countries to attract maximum foreign tourists in the country. It was announced by Secretary of Union Tourism

Ministry Vinod Zuthsi while addressing a function of Indian Association of Tour Operators in New Delhi. With this extension, the total 150 countries will come under the ambit of e-Tourist Visa Scheme from present 113 countries.

- JK Tyre has signed a binding agreement with Kesoram Industries to acquire its Haridwar unit. This agreement seeks to buy 100% equity in Kesoram Industries tyre unit in Uttarakhand in a deal value of 2,200 crore rupees. It should be noted that Kesoram sells its tyre under the Birla Tyres brand.
- The Union Cabinet has allowed 100 per cent foreign direct investment (FDI) under the automatic route for white label ATM operations (WLAO). Decision in this regard was taken in Union Cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi. This decision will expedite and ease FDI inflows in WLAO further giving a fillip to the government's ambitious effort to promote financial inclusion in the country, including the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojna (PMJDY).
- Union Cabinet cleared National Offshore Wind Energy Policy to generate electricity from offshore windmills located in areas within Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) of the country.
- The Union Cabinet approved introduction of Gold Monetization Schemes (GMS) in a bid to lure away Indians from buying physical gold. The approved schemes are Gold Deposit Scheme (GDS) and the Gold Metal Loan (GML) Scheme.
- Ace Indian Golfer Anirban Lahiri has become the first Indian to qualify for the prestigious President's Cup of Golf.
- Indian weightlifter Deepak Lather won a gold medal in fifth Commonwealth Youth Games (CYG) held in Apia, Samoa.

October 2015

- Heena Sindhu wins gold medal in women's 10 metre air pistol event in the Asian Air Gun Championship.

- India and Germany signed 18 MoUs in key areas of defence, manufacturing, trade, intelligence and clean energy during the first day visit of German Chancellor Angela Merkel.
- Jack Dorsey appointed as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Twitter.
- The 2015 Nobel Prize in Physics is awarded to Taakaki Kajita of Japan and Arthur B. McDonald (Canada) for their work in neutrino oscillations.
- FIFA suspends President Sepp Blatter and UEFA President Michael Platini for 90 days
- Tunisian National Dialogue Quartet has won the Nobel Peace Prize 2015 for its contribution to the building of democracy in Tunisia.
- South Africa wins the three match international T20 series against India 2-0.
- Sania Mirza-Martina Hingis win the China Open.

- British Economist Angus Deaton wins the 2015 Nobel Prize in Economics for his “analysis of consumption, poverty and welfare”.
- Younis Khan becomes the highest Test run scoring batsman for Pakistan during the first match against England in Abu Dhabi overtaking Javed Miandad’s previous best of 8832 runs.
- Indian pacer Zaheer Khan retired from international cricket. Zaheer Khan has picked up 311 wickets in 92 tests and 282 wickets in 200 ODIs.
- Marlon James won the prestigious Man Booker Prize for fiction for “A Brief History of Seven Killings”.
