10. Instruction: Examine the following six phrases and identify which set contains the incorrect usages.

Q1 – Answer: 2

After “one of the,” noun must be plural → “musicians.” Verb agrees with “one,” so “has” is correct.

Q2 – Answer: 3

“Committee” is treated as a single unit → singular verb “is.”

Q3 – Answer: 3

Singular subject “manager” requires “arrives,” not “arrive.”

Q4 – Answer: 2

Avoid double conjunctions. “Although” already shows contrast; “but” is unnecessary.

Q5 – Answer: 4

“Extraordinarily” modifies “difficult” → adverb.

Q6 – Answer: 3

Correct collocation: “accused of.”

Q7 – Answer: 2

“Discuss” does not take “about.” Use “discuss the merger.”

Q8 – Answer: 1

First conditional uses present simple → “if the team wins.”

Q9 – Answer: 3 (A, C, and D)

A is Correct: “Last” describes the encounter (Adjective).

C is Correct: “Lest” connects two clauses (Conjunction).

D is Correct: “That” relates back to the book (Relative Pronoun).

B is False: “Very” modifies the adverb “loudly,” making “very” an adverb.

E is False: “Continuously” modifies the verb “rained,” making it an adverb.

F is False: In that structure (“Such was... that...”), “that” is acting as a relative pronoun for ambition, not a conjunction.

Q10 - Correct Option: C (Statements 1, 5, and 6 are incorrect)

1 is Incorrect: One is “good at” a subject or skill, not “good in.”

5 is Incorrect: The correct idiom is “congratulated on” (e.g., congratulated him on his success).

6 is Incorrect: Use “among” for more than two people; “between” is strictly for two.

2 is Correct: “Married to” is the correct fixed preposition.

3 is Correct: “Arrived at” is used for specific locations like stations or airports.

4 is Correct: “Searching for” is the standard phrasal verb for looking for something.
